Though the children have been bitten by the holiday bug and are a little goofy, they are still hard at work

The younger children in the classroom are doing well with the Practical Life and Sensorial works. This is perfect, because, with these works, they are increasing their focus and concentration while establishing and reinforcing their pincer grasp, which they will need for writing later on. Some of our young friends have also been working on beginning Math work, such as Cards & Counters and the Short Bead Stair (naming and matching quantities for numbers 1-10).

The older children have been diligently working in the Math and Language areas. They seem to have an unquenchable thirst for more challenges, so they are keeping us busy!

The room is abuzz with the sound of Christmas music and the smells of pine trees, balsam, cinnamon, cloves and vanilla. The activities in Art and Practical Life have been changed out to reflect the themes of Christmas. The children are really enjoying them, especially the introduction of Oil Pastels and the effects of rubbing the material out to create different effects. Holiday Christmas balls and stocking Punch Outs also have them occupied.

In Practical Life, the children are challenged by making a product called god's eye. It uses two craft sticks and yarn to create a design using a textile. Some have been sewing buttons on Christmas trees, and others have been weaving multi-colored feathers into burlap pieces. All of these help to promote and strengthen the pincer grasp while creating joy in the children and beauty in our classroom.

On Friday, December 15, our Hibiscus friends will join us for some caroling. Therefore, we have been practicing some holiday songs so we can perform for each other and share in the joy of the season.

We are also hoping that Ms. Kamweli will present the tradition of Kwanzaa to us before the Winter break. This is a week long celebration of African heritage and culture that begins December 26 and concludes January 1.

The start of the 2017/18 School year has been amazing so far. Your children are treasures and we are so thankful that you are sharing them with us.
